

PCEE Attends PA Clean Energy Conference

SLIPPERY ROCK, PA – July 5, 2007 – Melissa Reynolds, Educational Programs Coordinator of the Pennsylvania Center for Environmental Education (PCEE), recently attended the PennFuture 2007 Annual Clean Energy Conference in Camp Hill, PA. The conference explored alternative energy options specific to Pennsylvania.

The conference was attended by state government officials, energy company executives, financiers of renewable energy and environmentalists.

“By attending conferences like this one, PCEE is able to expand its resources of information about such topics as renewable energy suppliers, grants, and funding sources that are most relevant to Pennsylvania,” said Kathleen Paul, Director of PCEE. “In addition, Melissa was able to interact with public and private leaders in the alternative energy community and broaden PCEE’s network of contacts – all of which improves the services PCEE can provide in fulfillment of its mission.”
